Communication Therapy

Our speech-language pathologists work with families and caregivers to help children maximize their communication skills and ability to participate in family life, preschool and peer relationships.

Our goal is to empower children and families, identifying and supporting each child's unique strengths and abilities.







Service Provision

Services are play based, with activities that are fun and purposeful, maximizing function.

We believe a child's family is an integral part of the therapy team. The primary service focus is training and support of caregivers so they can help their child learn and develop.

Depending on the child's needs, this training may be in group settings or one to one with the parent/caregiver present.









What do we Help With?

- Interactive skills (listening, talking playing)
- Strategies to promote language development
- Verbal communication
 - understanding spoken language
 - increasing speech clarity

Who's Eligible?

Children ages 0- kindergarten entry living in Surrey, Delta, White Rock or Langley with developmental delays including general delays and/or conditions like cerebral palsy, Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) and Down Syndrome.

School aged children are supported by school district speech-language pathologists. Please contact your child's school principal or integration support teacher for more information.
