Psychology and Family Services

The Psychology and Family Services department provides services to children with a developmental disability and a significant behavioural and/or mental health condition.

Department Programs & Staff

The department has three key programs:

- Psychology
- Family Services
- FASD/CDBC Key Worker Program

Our staff are experts in working with children who have a disability, and in working with children and youth who have mental health and behavioural concerns. Staff members include:

- Registered Psychologists
- Mental Health Clinicians
- Parent Support Workers
- Family Services Workers
- Key Workers



Psychology- Types of Services

We provide:

- consultation and strategies to families with a child who is having behavioural concerns
- counselling to children, youth, and families related to mental health concerns, disability, and/or behavioural concerns
- training to parents of children who are having difficulty learning the task of toilet training, and to parents who want to improve their children's daily living skills
- groups for parents of children with a disability to encourage support and to share experiences

Eligibility for Services

The department has three key programs:

Children and youth aged birth through 13 years old

Family Services-Types of Services

Family Services Workers (FSWs) are experts in helping families navigate through different systems.

Some services FSWs provide include:

- helping families to apply for services or funding from government or private sources for specialized equipment
- providing training and support on how to advocate for your child
- connecting families with appropriate resources in the community
- assisting families in completing The Centre's referral process
- empower parents to cope with interpersonal and family distress and stigma
- providing liaison and coordination with professionals and other agencies



Eligibility for Services

All families who are receiving services at The Centre are eligible for Family Services.

However, because of the limited number of FSWs on staff, we are only able to provide Family Services to a limited number of our clients.

In most cases, we will inform you if you are eligible for Family Services.
