Services are play based, with activities that are fun and purposeful, maximizing function.

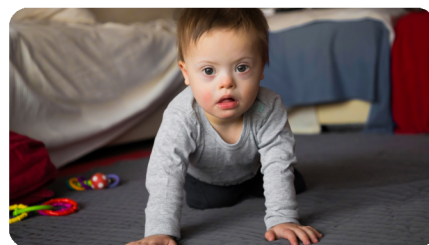
Physiotherapy support can include:

Who's Eligible?

Children ages 0-19 living in Surrey, Delta, White Rock or Langley with developmental delays including coordination challenges, gross motor delays and/or conditions like cerebral palsy, spina bifida, muscle disease or orthopedic conditions.

School services are coordinated through each school district and may vary from services described in this brochure. Please contact your child's school principal or integration support teacher for more information.
